

## **Wool Pesticide treatment records**

These record sheets are designed for any wool producer who wishes to keep records of pesticide use.

There is one main sheet to cover all treatments. Although other sheets are included the others are optional and intended to simplify the use of the records kept and increase their value to the producer. They can be discarded if the producer does not need the information or has it elsewhere in farm dairies.

### **STOCK TREATMENT RECORDS**

This is the essential page for all sheep treatment records. It is suitable for all external and internal treatments (e.g. lice, fly, footrot, drenches, vaccines etc.). This sheet contains the minimum information needed to trace back groups of animals or lines of wool and to plan sales of wool or animals if treatments need to be taken into account.

### **ANNUAL SHEEP SHEARING INVENTORY**

This is optional. It duplicates some information from the treatment record, but allows rewriting in the order mobs will be shorn. The Stock Treatment Record is entered in chronological order as treatments are carried out, so each mob may appear several times down the page, and some treatments may not be relevant to wool. The Shearing Inventory sheet can be filled in from the Stock Treatment Record and given to the classer if wool from some mobs needs to be combined or kept separate because of certain treatments. It can be used by the producer to decide how and where to sell certain lots, the compatibility or mixing of certain lines or mobs, or to decide whether to make declarations or request test on any or all lines of wool.

### **STOCK MANAGEMENT CALENDAR**

This sheet is optional and is to assist the producer to plan the time of the major sheep operations and treatments. This will ensure that the treatment is at the most effective time and also that a suitable time period is allowed between treatment and sale of wool stock.

### **STOCK MOVEMENT CALENDAR**

This sheet is optional and is designed to assist in keeping track of mobs of animals as they are moved, merged or split during the year. This will ensure that treatment records relating to specific mobs of animals at any time of the year can be related to appropriate groups at shearing or sale.

- Check the label for a withholding period (WHP) for meat. Animals must not be sold for slaughter within this period after treatment. A withholding period for wool means sheep must not be shorn within this period. If stock are to be sold for export an Export Slaughter Intervals (ESI) may apply, check with your stock agent. If the WHP and ESI are different then record both.
- Growers Tip: Write treatment down on the day.
